


Attending to social and health needs: working together or working against each other?







Els guardons van distingir a l'infèctològ Bonaventura Clotet i la matemàtica especialista en intel·ligència artificial (IA) Carme Torras, per les seves investigacions sobre el virus del VIH i les aplicacions de la robòtica, respectivament. Són un reconeixement no només a la ciència sinó, sobretot, al acte i capacitat de transformació social. Perquè aquest impacte i encara més es necessita inversió, van dir els premiats. "Ens donos", interpellava el Clotet als membres del Govern, presents a l'acte. Al recollir el premi l'infèctològ i director de l'IIR, va premet per la seva tasca internacional, durant més d'una trentena d'anys en el camp del VIH i altres malalties relacionades – va subratllar la necessitat d'un finançament que sigui, sobretot, ràpid. Expertos harán propuestas para recuperar el valor ético del cuidado en las ciudades

Según datos de las Naciones Unidas, el 13% de la población mundial actual es mayor de 60 años y para 2050, la población de séniors superará el 25% del total. Por lo general, las personas mayores suelen estar en situación de vulnerabilidad, de menor apoyo y, en consecuencia, mayor aislamiento social. En España, 47 millones de personas viven solas según el INE. De ellas, más de dos millones tienen más de 65 años. Hay más de 850.000 que han superado los 80 años y también viven solas. La soledad está en alza en todo el mundo occidental y en nuestro país, el 28,8% de las mujeres mayores y el 14,7% de los hombres mayores vive en soledad. Afrontar el envejecimiento requiere, por tanto, de cambios en el modelo de atención y un compromiso ético y social para garantizar la calidad de la atención y acompañamiento a las personas mayores.

Partiendo de esta premisa, la Fundación Mémora ha impulsado el Foro de Debate Sociedades Cuidadoras en el marco de su proyecto de acción social Ciudades que Cuidan, presentado en noviembre de 2019 en Madrid, en el que se celebra la primera convocatoria monográfica bajo el mismo nombre para contribuir, de manera activa, a la promoción de políticas y programas de atención al envejecimiento que favorezcan el acompañamiento de las personas mayores en situación de vulnerabilidad y/o en proceso final de vida.

Foro de Debate Sociedades Cuidadoras está concebido como un espacio de reflexión para conjuntar conocimientos y reflexiones sobre la necesidad de recuperar el valor ético del cuidado al envejecer para plantear fórmulas que permitan trasladar este conocimiento a la realidad de nuestras ciudades.

En concreto, el objetivo fundamental del Foro de Debate Sociedades Cuidadoras es sentar las bases sobre cómo, desde diferentes disciplinas del conocimiento, se pueden aportar ideas para evolucionar hacia una sociedad empática y solidaria que esté más comprometida con las necesidades de la ciudadanía, que sea empática y solidaria, en definitiva, una sociedad comprometida con un futuro más humano y donde la ciudad sea el sujeto activo referente.

Para ello se han estructurado 22 grupos de trabajo integrados por expertos procedentes de diversas áreas temáticas: Envejecimiento, Soledad, Ética, Sanidad (que incluye 6 subgrupos: Modelo Sanitario, Salud Pública, Medicina, Enfermería, Psicología, Farmacia), Política Social, Política Municipal, Voluntariado, Economía, Urbanismo, Ciencias, Educación, TIC, Comunicación, Investigación, Marco Legal, Feminismo y Ecología y Medioambiente.

Cada grupo estará integrado por un máximo de 5 miembros con un líder que realizará aportaciones desde su ámbito de especialidad a la temática central: recuperar el valor del cuidado de acuerdo a criterios de aplicabilidad en la práctica. La convocatoria tiene en cuenta con la participación de más de 100 profesionales de distintos ámbitos: académicos, intelectuales, filósofos, médicos, arquitectos, enfermeros, médicos, periodistas, etc.

La Prof. Victoria Camps, miembro del Patronato de la Fundación Mémora, Catedrática en Filosofía, Consejera Permanente del Consejo de Estado, presidenta de la Fundación Víctor Grifols y expresidenta del Comité de Bioética de España, ha destacado que, "con el paso de los años las personas hemos perdido la capacidad de cuidar, una habilidad que hoy es fundamental triticeo en el ser humano, y poco a poco se ha normalizado la idea de que los cuidados no son una responsabilidad de la comunidad. Esto ha supuesto normalizar las situaciones de soledad, envejecer en residencias en lugar de en el domicilio o profesionalizar los cuidados. Ante esta realidad", reafirma, "debemos recuperar el valor ético del cuidado, la importancia del valor ético. Todos debemos dar y recibir cuidados a lo largo de la vida, y especialmente en situaciones de vulnerabilidad".

Por su parte, el Presidente de la Fundación Mémora, Santiago de Torres, ha destacado que "la pandemia provocada por el Covid-19 ha puesto en evidencia la vulnerabilidad, especialmente la de los mayores, y que la epidemia de la soledad no desaparece es una realidad que ya exige la puesta en marcha de estrategias públicas y privadas para garantizar el cuidado de nuestros mayores y que nadie quede en soledad".
