Introduction:

The global crisis we are facing raises many ethical issues, such as whether we should give priority to helping vulnerable populations in developing countries, or first tend to those in need locally. In this new context, it is important to discuss the role of the private sector when public institutions are unable to meet the needs of the population due to cutbacks in grants and subsidies. Both publicprivate partnership strategies and international aid are in search of new definitions.

In contrast to the welfare culture that has traditionally been sustained, there are new initiatives that, in addition to involving local people and letting them take an active part in their development, go further and introduce new and original tools that can help organizations and nonprofit entities achieve the support and involvement of sectors that become key players in this current context, which were formerly not involved in charitable or solidarity issues.

Thomas Pogge, director of The Global Justice Program and professor of Philosophy and International Affairs the University of Yale, will reflect upon these matters in his keynote presentation. Two panel discussions with representatives from different entities will also present their views and some real-life cases of successful projects that are being conducted, as well as a set of practical tools to help non-profit organizations, either those that work locally or International aid organizations, to conduct effective and sustainable programs.
